



<p>Guidance for All Parents on additional safety precautions. Any questions please contact your Nursery Manager</p>	
Drop-off and collection	<p>Parents and children encouraged to walk or cycle to the nursery where possible. If using public transport please follow government guidance</p> <p>Only one parent should accompany or pick up your child</p> <p>You must use the call point at main entrance door (or second entrance door to Rosedene where applicable in your nursery). A member of staff will take handover or drop off your child from this entrance door.</p> <p>You must maintain social distance from other parents who may be waiting at the entrance. It is important, for your own safety, that you remain at least two metres apart from other people and do not congregate in groups.</p> <p>Please allow a little more time than normal to drop off and collect.</p> <p><u>Parents are not allowed beyond the Rosedene entrance door (if this is part of a wider centre you are allowed in the lobby).</u></p> <p>Hand sanitiser is at the entrance and you should use this.</p> <p>Siblings should not accompany you when dropping off or picking up. If it is unavoidable then siblings should remain in your vehicle</p>
Attendance	<p>You must not bring your child to the nursery if you or your child is displaying any symptoms of coronavirus</p> <p>Children who have been classed as clinically extremely vulnerable and clinically vulnerable due to pre-existing medical conditions are advised to shield and stay at home</p> <p>If a child lives in a household with someone who is extremely clinically vulnerable or clinically vulnerable you should follow government guidance when deciding if you wish them to attend the nursery</p>
If your child becomes unwell	<p>COVID-19: guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection guidance</p> <p>If your child becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or loss of sense of smell or taste whilst at the nursery we have to send them home and you should follow the COVID-19: guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection guidance. Presently you will be advised to self-isolate for 10 days. Your fellow household members should self-isolate for 10 days.</p> <p>All staff and children who are attending an childcare setting will have access to a test if they display symptoms of coronavirus, and are encouraged to get tested in this scenario.</p> <p>If the result of the test is positive please tell us so we can take steps to protect others at the nursery who may have been in contact. If the test is negative your child can return to the nursery</p>
	<p>If your child becomes unwell at the nursery and is waiting to be collected, we shall move them to a room where they can be isolated, with a member of staff supervising your child at all times</p>



Where the child or staff member tests negative	<p>Your child can return to the nursery.</p> <p><u>Even if your child does not come back to the nursery immediately please tell us of the negative test result so we can stand down our internal alert.</u></p>
Where the child or staff member tests positive	<p>The rest of their group, including staff from that group within the nursery will be sent home and advised to self-isolate for 10 days</p> <p>Please refer to the latest evolving government guidance as to the availability of testing</p>
Taking precautions	<p>Parents, carers and nurseries do not need to take children's temperatures every morning. Routine testing of an individual's temperature is not the only method for identifying coronavirus. We reiterate to you the need to follow the standard national advice on the kind of symptoms to look out for that might be due to coronavirus, and where to get further advice. The present NHS guidance is that identifying symptoms are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)2. new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)3. loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal
Hygiene	<p>The 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach is promoted in nursery</p> <p>Hand washing will be frequent throughout the day, with children hand-washing activities</p> <p>Please ensure that your child knows about frequent handwashing, safe sneezing and coughing and safe disposal of tissues</p> <p>Hand sanitizers are available at the entrance and corridor for parents, and throughout the nursery for staff members and children.</p> <p>You should use any appropriate hand moisturisers offsite due to allergy risk to other children</p>
Breakfast/ Afterschool/ Wrap-around	<p>To minimise the mixing of children groups, Breakfast, Afterschool and wrap-around are temporarily suspended, however please continue to speak with your manager so we can accommodate your needs</p>
Outdoor Learning	<p>We will be utilising our outdoor space at all opportunities. Please equip your child with the appropriate clothing for each day</p>
Drinking bottles, toys and items from home	<p>Children should bring their own water bottles when first attending the nursery. These will be kept at the nursery to minimise the possibility of introduction of infection to and from the nursery.</p> <p>For the same reason please ensure that you do not bring in other items for your child to the nursery.</p>
